A crucial part of In His Steps' after school SPASE program is the daily devotional. Every day after the students arrive from school, the 22 second and third graders spend intentional time with the Lord with a devotional and journaling, led by program director, Jasmine Thompson. Every day, the students gather together to hear from the Word of God and have a time of guided prayer journaling. **This month Ms. Jasmine has taught the SPASE students the names of God and their meanings. We have been blessed to see our students grow in understanding of the God who loves them,** and we continue to pray that each of them will choose to enter into a personal, saving relationship with Him.

In addition to the students' daily devotion, our robotics instructor, Cameron

Arcemont, has created a long-term Bible reading plan and challenge for the students. When he began teaching robotics to the second and third graders this year, he also brought Bibles and a challenge for the students to read--5 chapters a week, every week, with hopes to read through the entire Bible within 6 or 7 years. This reading plan also builds accountability with the students with weekly Bible quizzes and a simple reward system that helps motivate the students to read all five chapters.

When asked why he brought this program to In His Steps, he said, "spending time with God has changed my life, and I wish I had started when I was their age. I'm going to be with these kids for the next 8-9 years, so I knew this was a great opportunity to really build that relationship with the Lord early."

This reading plan is affecting more than just the kid's lives as well-- "Some of the parents have come to me and asked questions about the quizzes because they're helping their kids read and answer the quiz, and we get the opportunity to share the gospel with them when that happens. It's awesome." This time spent reading the Bible with their children also strengthens

the relationships between parent and child, and creates a space for the love of God to enter the home.

While it can sometimes seem like there isn't much progress, Cameron notes that where the students started and where they are now in their understanding of the Bible is completely different, and the growth is obvious. Several of our students have asked deep, thought-provoking questions, and it's been our greatest pleasure to be able to answer them in a way that makes sense to these young minds.

Our second and third graders are critically thinking through the stories they're reading, and finding ways to apply them to their life. We hope you'll pray for growth in all of our students and that their hearts would soften daily towards the Savior who loves them dearly.

In His Steps' guiding principle behind the Compassion Store is to offer an environment that fosters good stewardship, Biblical charity, and responsibility. In His Steps puts this into practice by recruiting groups from local churches to join together and purchase gifts for pre-approved families in Canton who have experienced financial hardship. The parents of the children are then able to come and purchase new gifts at a deeply discounted rate, instilling a sense of pride and maintaining their dignity. One of our first time Compassion Store recipients was Jessie Handy who has been involved with In His Steps for the past 13 years. She said, "The Compassion Store was truly a blessing. My mom passed away last January, so the budget was thin this year from having to pay for funeral costs. The Compassion Store was God's way of providing for us."

SUCCESS STORY

Connell Moore first got connected to In His Steps through IHS former Sports Ministry Director, Joshua Jackson. Jackson was passionate about In His Steps reaching the community, so he formed a basketball team with local youth including Connell from the Saw Mill Quarters which is a "challenged community" just east of In His Steps. After participating in the sports ministry, Connell got a job in the IHS teaching garden and was placed in the IHS Earn & Save Program. This program allowed Connell to learn responsibility in his work ethic and accountability with his money. It was through this program that Connell became an integral part of In His Steps, serving with the summer sports programs and working in the garden regularly. His faith with the Lord grew during this time, and when he graduated high school, Connell knew he wanted to do something big with his life, something that would glorify God first. Connell decided after high school to enroll in an out of state institution with several programs that he was interested in. Due to unforeseen and tragic circumstances Connell had to withdraw when led to emotional trauma.

After one year, Connell enrolled again in school, but this time at Hinds Community College, just a few miles down the road from his hometown of Canton. While he began in remedial classes, he worked hard in all of his studies, and his second year at Hinds he was moved to the Honors College. As a first generation college student, Connell was excelling in everything he did.

Now, Connell has been placed on the President's list for the Fall 2019 semester at Hinds for maintaining a 4.0 GPA for the entire semester, and we couldn't be more proud of him! He will graduate in December 2020 with an Associate's degree and dual certification in welding and pipe laying. Connell's story shows us that when God begins something, He will faithfully sustain until the end. As Rev. Bacon says, "I've seen God's thumbprint on Connell's life through all of it"
