Another Opportunity for Service: The New IHS Campsite

For over 26 years, In His Steps has provided creative and specialize Christ-centered ministries for community youth, local athletes, juvenile offenders, and their parents. The IHS board and staff have been led to start a Christian campsite and training center, which will provide summer and weekend camping and specialized training for youth leaders, college interns, parents and ministry leaders.

Since acquiring 19 acres of land, a \$100,000 matching gift has been pledged toward the payoff, construction of 3 cabins, repairs on existing structure, and pond management. A total of \$88,748 has been given toward the \$100,000 matching gift, with a total of \$314,252 yet needed to complete the payoff of the first phase of the campsite development.

In addition, IHS welcomes Christian friends and ministry partners to help make this Christian camp one that would be most pleasing to our Lord and Saviour.
