In 2016, the Mississippi legislature passed a bill raising the bar of the third grade “reading gate” that was originally passed in 2013. This initiative was to further ensure that Mississippi students learn to read by the fourth grade. In His Steps Ministries (IHS) has continued to fulfill its mission by using ongoing innovative and specialized programs through the S.P.A.S.E. Saturday Morning Reading program.

Research makes it clear that students who never fully learn to read early on will be unable to succeed in higher grades. Our reading program continues to equip struggling students with the individualized instruction that they need to be successful.

Carolyn Bacon, the program’s coordinator, states, “It is important that we help our students gain and master essential comprehension skills and strategies so that they are successful not only in school, but also in life. It is our desire that this program improves our students’ ability to understand what they read.”

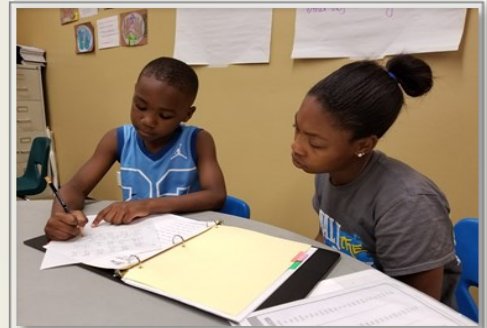

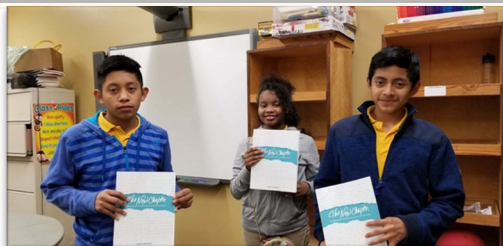
Today's students need to develop these skills so that they are able to navigate complex life situations and work environments. Our goal at IHS is to ensure that our students are empowered academically, spiritually and socially for God's glory. We understand that by introducing coding to learners early on, we can prepare them for life.

IHS has continued to offer computer programming opportunities to students to ensure that they develop the critical thinking skills that are an integral part of 21st Century Education. **Cameron Arcemont has been coming every Monday for two years to teach our students computer coding.** Coding is important because it helps students reflect on their own learning. Cameron uses various strategies such as Khan Academy to ensure students are able to make connections to real-world applications while learning computer programming. He has been very committed to working with our students, and we praise God for Cameron's faithfulness.

Career Readiness Helps Students Focus on College

In January 2018, **In His Steps Ministries** started **THE NEXT CHAPTER** program as another way to empower our students. This program, developed and executed by Andrea Jones-Davis with Toot, Teach and Roll LLC, seeks to ensure that all students will have an individualized plan for life after high school. In a partnership with the Canton Public School District, students were selected from the 9th grade academy to participate in this program. The program is held weekly on Thursdays. The students being served include IHS S.P.A.S.E. students and those who were referred from the school district.

Zariah Ingram states that she is glad that her teacher referred her to the program because it teaches her Christian values that help her in school. She makes it clear that this program has helped her understand what to look for in a college and how to start preparing now while she is still in school. **Cedrick Grant, IHS student, states** that he is grateful for the program because it shows him how much his academics matter now. **THE NEXT CHAPTER** program allows students to develop their own college plan for life after high school. Topics include study habits, time management, resume building, career goals, financial resources, important information on the process of selecting a school, etc. We understand that ongoing progress monitoring is vital in education and the **THE NEXT CHAPTER'S** evaluation process evaluates the outcomes and goals of services provided through pre-and-post surveys, verbal feedback, participants' active contributions to the targeted projects and plans. **Carolyn Bacon believes that this is an important tool that will help students understand what it takes to accomplish their career goals.**
