It's springtime in Mississippi, so that means it's time to prep our teaching garden. We have begun preparing and planting in the garden with local youth and their families. We are anticipating a great harvest in the coming months. The purpose of our teaching garden is to have a space where kids and their families can learn the skill of gardening and the importance of healthy eating. The teaching garden provides an opportunity for much learning and growing.

On a few beautiful sunny days in April, some of IHS students, parents, and grandparents helped prepare and plant. The students who came were able to use tools to dig and aerate the soil before planting the seeds. The children beamed with curiosity as Mrs. Deb Primos, Master Gardener, taught them the science behind each task they completed. For example, when planting the seeds,

they had to dig a specific amount of inches into the soil to avoid the seeds from rotting. In addition, she instructs the children on soil preparation, cultivating and harvesting. Mrs. Primos takes advantage of the many teachable moments about planting techniques and garden management and relates them to biblical teaching. She emphasized the importance of seeds going into good soil as we stated

in passages like Matthew 13. Verse 8 states, "Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown." The word of God is the seed that grows when planted in the good soil of our life.

While working in the garden, several parents reminisced with their children about their early years of gardening. It is fun process and also an important skill that can stay with a person throughout their whole life.

After everything is planted, the children and parents are anticipating seeing a greater yield. Our summer harvest usually provides an abundance of vegetables and blueberries. In addition, the produce provides a source of income for some students as they are able to work part-time in gathering and selling the crop.

Therefore, we teach our children and their families the importance of being good stewards to their bodies.

Art Classes Through Virtual Mentoring

In 2020, the entire world shifted as the pandemic spread and our lives were interrupted. Because of social distancing, many schools and businesses went virtual. The community in Canton, Mississippi was duly impacted as well. In His Steps Ministries needed to adapt quickly. This is why we created our new Virtual Mass Mentoring Program. Thankfully, in this age of technology, programs like zoom and other virtual platforms have enabled us to continue ministering in creative ways.

The consequences of the pandemic seemed dire at first, but now we see

the challenges as opportunities for growth and creative ways to do ministry. The goal of this program is to reach students virtually while remaining socially distanced at In His Steps, and we were forced to find ways to use technology to impact student's lives. Since we still cannot have large groups of students and mentors in the building, IHS was able to virtually go into student's homes. We have been able to collaborate with one of our partners, Crossway Community Church, Irvine, California to offer a virtual art class.



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At In His Steps, we always strive to cultivate new skills and passions in our students, and many of our S.P.A.S.E. students are interested in art and other creative subjects.

Art and drawing is a way for students to learn new skills while expressing themselves. Art instruction helps youth develop motor skills, language skills, social skills, and decision-making. It also encourages self-expression and creativity and can build confidence as well as a sense of individual identity. This program is unique because it also incorporates God's love and biblical foundations. Christin Howard, IHS Sports Director, said, "We are consistently showing God's love throughout the program and during devotionals; we are exposing them to innovative activities that are improving their leadership skills, social skills, and self-confidence."

IHS implemented this program to further develop useful skills and utilize technology to do ministry. IHS values innovation and creativity. The pandemic forced us to think outside the box to continue the impactful ministry. Mrs. Carolyn Bacon, Director of Personnel and Volunteer Coordinator said, "We were praying about things that could be done to serve our students during this time since we could not meet face to face."

During these virtual classes, Kevin Adams and his wife, Patty, instructs students on various drawing and art techniques and encourages them to be creative. In His Steps has partnered with Kevin Adams, an animator and artist based in California, to teach weekly virtual art classes.

Mrs. Bacon says in the future, "we would love to be able to offer more activities virtually. This class has allowed us to serve more students and has open new doors." For now, our Virtual Mass Mentoring program has started with virtual art classes. However, our hope is to implement other subjects and skills that students are interested in collaboration with IHS partners and friends in Mississippi and beyond.
